I want to take this opportunity to tell you how very proud I am to be a member of the TACCP and of our membership. I am honored to serve as president of such a great organization. The tornadoes which devastated communities and affected so many of us proved to be an occasion for our membership to pull together and show their compassion and commitment for one another. THANK YOU!!!

I have got a lot of news to share with you, as the TACCP has been busy:

- ❖ The Governor's DUI Task Force has begun their work and will be meeting each month through September in order to present their recommendations to the Governor by October. Memphis Deputy Chief Janice Pilot is the TACCP representative.
- ❖ On March 31st, Governor Phil Bredesen announced in Franklin, TN that the TACCP would receive a \$500,000 grant to develop and implement an Internet Predators Awareness Program statewide. Maggi will be preparing a formal proposal for presentation to the Governor in June. The funding is part of the Governor's budget and therefore, the legislature will have to pass the budget in order for us to receive the funding for the 2006-2007 fiscal year. I want to thank Maggi Duncan for recognizing this opportunity and going after it for the association. This is definitely something we can all hang our hats on!! Maggi will be updating us after she and the Governor's office finalize things.
- ❖ The legislature passed a bill last year that would require all first responders to receive Emergency Driving Training annually. The TACCP and the TN Municipal League Risk Management Pool have partnered to offer this training statewide. We will be doing East TN in May and the Chiefs meeting on May 31st. - ❖ The association raised over \$5800 for Hurricane Relief and donated it to the Mississippi Association of Chiefs of Police for the Law Enforcement Officers Fund. This money will be used by an officer or officers who lost everything.
